Abstract

Suppose K is a nonempty closed convex nonexpansive retract of a real uniformly convex Banach space E with P as a nonexpansive retraction. Let $T : K \rightarrow E$ be a non-self mapping which is asymptotically nonexpansive in the intermediate sense with $F(T) := \{x \in K : Tx = x\} \neq \emptyset$. A demiclosed principle for T is proved. Moreover, if T is completely continuous, an iterative sequence $\{xn\}$ is constructed which converges strongly to some $x^* \in F(T)$. If T is not assumed to be completely continuous but the dual E* of E is assumed to have the Kadec-Klee property, then $\{xn\}$ converges weakly to some $x^* \in F(T)$. The operator P which plays a central role in our proofs is, in this case, the Banach space analogue of the proximity map in Hilbert spaces.
